**Day to Day Activities:** Coordination of staff, treatment loads, and managing the Bronchoscopy Suite. Other duties include assisting with management of the ABG Lab, ordering stock, scheduling staff and assisting with NRP, PALS, ACLS, and CPR classes.

**Your first Job:** I graduated from the CRT program at Black River College in 1991 and began my career at SBRMC.
